






- Ava M in 7A for appearing in theatre production 'Matilda' at Number 8 in Pershore;

Focus on Enrichment

Our pupils have experienced another great term of Enrichment lessons in years 7 and 8, where we focus on delivering experiences linked to our school motto of 'Learning Together for Success' and that seek to go beyond the National Curriculum. Mrs Matthews, our Head of Year 6 and Careers Lead, has introduced the Warburton's Innovation Team Challenge to develop team work and critical thinking skills— pupils have responded really positively to this project.

Meanwhile, Mrs Dorrell has continued to introduce pupils to a range of cultural festivals and celebrations that are time-relevant to the sessions. These include events more familiar to us, such as St Patrick's Day, but also significant experiences that pupils might not have been aware of, such as the Japanese Festival of Hanami.



Miss Lloyd's Photography sessions have continued to challenge our pupils. The changing of the seasons across our school site has provided an excellent opportunity for some cleverly-crafted shots, capturing pupils' understanding of a range of photographic techniques in an imaginative fashion.

Our beautiful gardens and school grounds have also helped Miss Bankes and Mr Pearce develop pupils' awareness of local nature and the importance of monitoring and recording species and habitats.







Focus on Science



STEM club continues to be a popular extra-curricular opportunity during Friday lunchtimes for all year groups. Each week, pupils have had the opportunity to attempt different experiments or activities, including: bubble snakes; attempting to make hand warmers; looking at the effects of caffeine on reaction times; and considering whether taste is based on the information from our taste buds alone or if we are able to trick our senses.

We celebrated Science Week between 11th - 20th March with a love of all things STEM. There was a whole school assembly, which launched a STEM poster-based competition and all year assemblies had a STEM focus. Furthermore, there was the opportunity for all pupils to tune into the Royal Institute's 'Energy Live' experience within a science lesson.



Focus on English

This term has been a lively and vivacious one. Our pupils' learning has gone from strength to strength in English.




The year six English groups have immersed themselves in Dylan Thomas' 'A Child's Christmas In Wales' and a range of ghost stories. Pupils have continued to develop their retrieval, comprehension, summary, questioning and inferring skills whilst reading the texts. They have all developed their writing skills by completing their own memoirs and are currently writing their own ghost stories. Many are using the school as a setting

and have used visits to our fabulous school gardens for inspiration. In particular, pupils developed vocabu-

lary choices, sentence structures and have been exploring the effect punctuation choices have. All year six students have been provided with a CGP book to aid their revision of KS2 learning. At present, Year 6 are also using the PiXL Unlock App to consolidate vocabulary knowledge. The year six cohort also behaved superbly during the March practice SATs experience and applied themselves diligently. Well done, Year Six.





Year Seven continue to explore the concepts of heroism and villainy. Chaucer's 'The Knight's Tale' has been explored and dissected as a text coming from the English canon of literature. The year group have continued to question: how do pupils use quotations to support their opinions whilst exploring how writers construct continuous texts? They have been studying how Chaucer's characters come across to a modern reader. They have had many varied thoughts and they have conveyed these through their



written responses. We have enjoyed reading their carefully crafted tales too. They are now learning how poets employ heroes and villains in the poetic form.

Year Eight learning continues to be based around the concept of 'conflict' in English. They have all been given the opportunity to learn about Aristotle's 'Art of Rhetoric' and were inspired by modern voices such as Emma Watson, Greta Thunberg and the Obamas. The speeches that Year 8 then crafted and delivered on a variety of personally selected topics were engaging, mature and emotional. The cohort are now studying a range of modern novels which all focus around conflict and how different characters manage these experiences. It is inspiring to see the pupils thoughtfully responding to these texts.









Focus on Mathematics

In February, a group of 10 Year 8s were invited to take part in the Intermediate Mathematical Challenge organised by the UK Mathematics Trust, part of the University of Leeds.

The Intermediate Mathematical Challenge is a 60-minute, multiple-choice activity, which is completed online. It encourages mathematical reasoning, precision of thought and fluency in using basic mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems. The main aim of the challenge is to make participants think whilst having fun.

Congratulations to those who took part—in particular Harrison L, who was awarded a silver certificate and Liam H, who was awarded a bronze certificate. All other entrants were awarded a certificate of participation.

In addition to this, Harrison progressed to the next round of the challenge, the 'Grey Kangaroo'. He took part in this round in April and was awarded a certificate of qualification for his efforts: well done, Harrison!



The Junior Mathematical Challenge takes place after Easter and a group consisting of 60 Year 8s and 10 Year 7s have been invited to take part in this. We look forward to sharing further successes with you next term.

House Point Update




